SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The National Security Council (NSC) was chartered under the National Security Act of 1947 to advise the president concerning domestic and foreign policy issues. Following an underutilization by President Harry S. Truman, the NSC became the hub of policy planning under Dwight D. Eisenhower and successive presidents. Richard M. Nixon determined that the White House, and by extension the NSC, would dominate the foreign policy of the United States. Nixon had a sincere distrust of the State Department's bureaucracy. The combination of this distrust and the decision to manage foreign policy through the White House led to the selection of William P. Rogers as secretary of state. The appointment of Rogers, a newcomer to foreign affairs, signaled the dominance of the White House over the State Department.¹

This dominance of foreign policy is clearly seen in the conversations, cables, letters, and memoranda found in *The Richard M. Nixon National Security Files, 1969–1974, Middle East*. This collection is rich in primary documents that show the formation of national policy for the Middle East. The collection is divided into country specific sections. Each section generally contains documents related to the foreign and military assistance provided by the United States. This foreign assistance takes many forms including food assistance provided under PL-480 (Food-for-Peace) and direct monetary assistance. In some cases, the documents contain information relating to foreign direct investment, the policy of encouraging U.S.-based corporations to invest in other countries. This collection details the various methods of providing military assistance employed by the United States. The most common was to arrange directly the sale of military equipment; however, this was not always the most politically expedient method. At times, the United States sought to supply a country with military assistance but could not withstand the congressional scrutiny required by the transaction. When the United States is unable to transact business directly, it often relies on third-party arms sales. In this model, the United States authorizes an intermediary country to sell U.S.-made weapons to the third country. This prevents the congressional oversight of the transaction, while still fulfilling the strategic needs of the beneficiary country. This collection makes it clear that arms sales are complex transactions. There are multiple instances where the United States sold weapons to both sides of one conflict, such as India and Pakistan.

This collection covers an era of great political and military turmoil in the Middle East. The period included a large number of military conflicts, such as the War of Attrition, the Yom Kippur War, Black September, the Indo-Pakistani War of 1971, and the Bangladesh Liberation War. Add to these conflicts the ever-present specter of the Vietnam War and the U.S. battle against communism, and one can only imagine the quantity of documents available in this collection.

While this collection contains information from most countries that are collectively considered the Middle East, it also contains information from countries not classically included in this definition. Specifically, multiple documents cover the 1974 coup in Cyprus and the subsequent Turkish invasion of the island. This collection also covers the situation in Vietnam and Laos, but this information generally appears in smaller quantities.

Starting on Frame 0471 of Reel 28, the reader will discover the first concrete document in this collection that links the United States with the People's Republic of China. This document, dated December 22, 1969, does not contain any information relating to Nixon's subsequent visit to China in 1972, but it does show the origin of the change in relations. The document describes the passing of messages between the United States and China, using Pakistani President Yahya Khan as the intermediary. While the substance of the message was routine at best, this memo is the beginning of the process that resulted in Henry A. Kissinger's visit to China in 1971 and Nixon's trip in 1972.

Conspicuous in its absence from this collection is any information relating to Saudi Arabia. Reel 32 contains six folders titled Saudi Arabia, but all documents in these folders have been withdrawn from the official record. There is only one additional reference to Saudi Arabia, related to military assistance, in the entire collection. While it is common practice to redact or withdraw documents that are vital to national security, it is uncommon to encounter entire folders without documents.

Due to the wide range of included documents, *The Richard M. Nixon National Security Files, 1969–1974, Middle East* provides a rich source of national security information. The scope of this collection, from personal notes to policy statements, offers uncommon insight into the daily operation of the Nixon White House.

EDITORIAL NOTE

LexisNexis has filmed all documents in their entirety from Boxes 591–666 of the Nixon National Security Council Files. Some individual documents remain classified or unprocessed. “Nixon Presidential Material Project Document Control Records” itemize documents that have been withdrawn from the folders, due either to national security or privacy restrictions. LexisNexis has microfilmed these withdrawal sheets in the position in which the National Archives staff placed them.

The National Security Council (NSC) was chartered under the National Security Act of 1947 to advise the president concerning domestic and foreign policy issues. Following an underutilization by President Harry S. Truman, the NSC became the hub of policy planning under Dwight D. Eisenhower and successive presidents. Richard M. Nixon determined that the White House, and by extension the NSC, would dominate the foreign policy of the United States. Nixon had a sincere distrust of the State Department's bureaucracy. The combination of this distrust and the decision to manage foreign policy through the White House led to the selection of William P. Rogers as secretary of state. The appointment of Rogers, a newcomer to foreign affairs, signaled the dominance of the White House over the State Department. *The Richard M. Nixon National Security Files, Middle East, 1969–1974* chronicle the diplomatic influence of Nixon, Kissinger, Rogers, and others in the Middle East.

This collection includes detailed information about the role of the United States in the Middle East during the Nixon Administration. Most documents in this collection are memoranda and notes between the diplomatic corps stationed in the Middle East and the leadership in the United States. The majority of these documents contain information about foreign and military assistance awarded by the United States to many Middle Eastern countries. The foreign assistance generally takes the form of food and money, while military assistance almost always refers to arms sales. Between the assistance documents, the reader will find information related to diplomatic protocol and decorum.

Many readers will recognize the major players in this collection. Henry A. Kissinger, Nixon's National Security Advisor, appears in many of the folders. In addition to Kissinger, Secretary of State Rogers and Nixon himself make multiple appearances. Experts in the Middle Eastern relations might recognize many of the career Foreign Service officers, such as Talcott W. Seelye, Joseph S. Farland; Walworth Barbour, Kenneth B. Keating; and Hermann F. Eilts. Others might recognize members of the National Security Council such as Harold S. Saunders, Henry R. Appelbaum, Brent Scowcroft, and Alexander M. Haig Jr.

Starting on Frame 0471 of Reel 28, the reader will discover the first concrete document in this collection that links the United States with the People's Republic of China. This document, dated December 22, 1969, does not contain any information relating to Nixon's subsequent visit to China in 1972, but it does show the origin of the change in relations. The document describes the passing of messages between the United States and China, using Pakistani President Yahya Khan as the intermediary. While the substance of the message was routine at best, this memo is the beginning of the process that resulted in Henry A. Kissinger's visit to China in 1971 and Nixon's trip in 1972.
