Map out American history with access to over 63,000 maps from the U.S. Serial Set. Maps range from the great exploratory surveys and battlefield maps of the 19th century, to water resources, weather, wilderness, public works, and Army Corps of Engineers maps extending through the 1960s. Abstracted and indexed cartobibliographic records provide direct access to fully viewable, zoomable, and downloadable PDFs.

The Monthly Catalog is the only authoritative index that provides single-point, online access to high-value U.S. documents created by all three branches of the U.S. government for more than a century. It offers the complete backfile of re-keyed bibliographic records from monthly catalog issues with archival-quality page images.

DIGITAL NATIONAL SECURITY ARCHIVE

The Digital National Security Archive includes tens of thousands of declassified documents, many obtained through the Freedom of Information Act. The Archive is made up of 41 individual collections, each based on a single topic, with theme-based collections also available.
